

Century Band Boosters
Parent meeting minutes
3/14/2023

- Winter Showcase recap (Maria Crowell). Thanks to everyone who helped make the day successful! Thanks to the adult and student volunteers who all showed up and were willing to be flexible! The band made almost \$7000.
- Winter percussion and guard. The guard won their division at the showcase. Percussion took 3rd in theirs. Both groups performed for assemblies on 3/13. Great job to everyone!
- Wind Ensemble competition (3/14). The kids played really well today. They also did well in sight reading.
- Jazz festival (3/18) @CCC. Buses leave at 7:30 am. If you want to pick up your jazz 2 students when they are finished or bring your 1:00 jazz band student by 12:30 you can, just let Mr Dunlop know. We will need at least one parent to ride the bus each way.
- Cluster concert (3/21). This concert includes all feeder schools and all of our bands. It should last about 1 hr 15 min. High school students should help set up or help clean up. They can help clean up Monday night, Tuesday before the concert or after the concert. This is a required part of their grade for the concert.
- CHOMP (starts 3/23). Flyers will be ready to hand out next Tuesday at the cluster concert. We know it is only one week before spring break but this way we can get everyone registered and get music handed out. Then it gives us more time after spring break to get ready for the concert.
- Trip updates
 - San Francisco. An updated Itinerary was handed out at the meeting (see end of these minutes). The circuit changed the school for the competition (new school is Amador HS, Pleasanton, CA). Mr Dunlop did not have any luck finding a school to stay in so we will stay in a hotel Friday and Saturday nights and drive back overnight on Sunday. We will get back to Century on Monday morning. Students have signed up for rooms and bus seats. They will need to stay in their groups of at least 4 when they are not with a chaperone during free time. We have about 50 students going on this trip. They should bring money for food for the drive down on Friday. They can also have snacks on the bus.
 - Reno. Mr Dunlop just got performance times this afternoon. He will start putting together an itinerary and send it out when it is ready. Univ. of Nevada, Reno is within walking distance to Circus Circus, where we will be staying. We will leave Thursday. The festival is on Friday and Saturday. We will drive back on Sunday.

- Victoria: The local chamber of commerce has been helping us find a gym to stay in. We will take a school bus up on Saturday. Sunday has some activities our groups can perform in. The parade is on Monday. We will take a charter bus back right after the parade on Monday. Everyone needs to have a passport to go.
- Fundraising

 - All orders will need to go through the band website. It is up and ready now. Hand pies are likely going away in the fall so if you like them, this may be your last chance to stock up. There will be some overage when they are delivered because we have to order in full cases. The extras will be up for sale at pickup on a first-come-first-serve basis. We will not be able to take any late orders this time so make sure you get yours in by the end of the day on 4/4!
 - Can drive (3/18). Please come help if you can. We can always use more adult volunteers.
 - Mother's Day flower baskets (4/10-4/24), pick up 5/10-5/11
 - "It's a Small World" fundraiser (5/2) (Dunlop). The students will go out to the neighborhood and play music. Neighbors can choose to donate.
 - Jazz auction (Dunlop). We are still working on finalizing the date on that. We will get more information out asap.
 - Hops concessions (Sheryl Hughes). We need to know if we have enough interest to be able to cover a stand for next year. Games start in April. They have a new system that means we can receive tips in cash and on credit card payments. Sheryl will put together a survey to send out about interest. Students need to be 15 to work with a parent, 16 without. Food handlers (everyone) and olcc (adults) are required.
 - Noodles and Co fundraiser (25% back). March 22.
