Marching Season

Marching band season was great and everyone had lots of fun. Our performance at championships was 2nd highest placing, and our 2nd highest score that the Century band has ever gotten. The color guard had great gains in their scores over last year. Mike Leone has already committed to working with our band for next year. The theme for next year's show will be announced at overnight party in December. Our show this season was a great crowd pleaser. Teachers showed videos of our performance in their classrooms. It is great to see other Century students and staff so excited about the band. Being able to practice on the turf field with lights was a huge plus for us this season.

CHOMP

CHOMP has lots of high school volunteers this year. 99 kids are enrolled so far. 6th grade band numbers at the feeder schools are smaller this year than they have been the last few years.

Disney trip

Mr Dunlop passed out a more detailed itinerary for the trip (see the end of this document). We have applied for the Disneyland parade and should hear back soon. We will be marching in the Felton, CA Memorial Day parade. We will spend some time in Felton checking out their festivities and then drive down to Anaheim.

Fundraisers

The pie order this time around was huge! Thanks for being patient with mixup with the pumpkin pies. Thanks to Aurea Taylor and Laura Thraves for organizing the pie fundraiser. The sales earned a total of about \$4400 in student accounts. There are a few extra pies left left over. Contact Pauline if you are interested in buying one. The Scentsy fundraiser is happening now. Packets are available in the band room. 100% of the profit will go into band accounts. Students will not get a fundraiser point for this fundraiser. Kathy Heider is running this fundraiser. Contact her for info. Christmas trees. You can print the presale form or get copy from band room. Everyone needs to turn in one form per tree presold. Please make sure all of the information it is legible in case we need to contact the buyer. Please let people know that they will need to have their receipt to pick up a tree. Lot signup will be coming soon. Set up will be on November 30th. There will be a seperate signup for that. The lot opens Dec 1. Students can sign up for setup and 2 shifts at the lot. Students who are helping in the lot will be helping families get trees to vehicles and helping keep the lot clean. Students can also sign up to be sign holders. Sign holders will be on TV Highway at Century and at 67th. Shifts for the lot are 2 hours each. Students get one point for preselling at least one tree and one for each shift.

There are concessions shifts still open. Concessions is a big money maker for the band. We especially need more adults to sign up. Fred Meyer cards can be linked to the band. Instructions are on the band website. Rainy Day games - Students can sign in to get the point for the fundraiser at any time during the day on Dec 7th. It doesn't need to be in the evening. Can drives - We have made about \$8500 from can drives so far this year. There is about \$5000 more worth of cans in the truck waiting to be cashed in.

Winter guard

There will be an open gym on Tuesday for people who are interested. This is not a tryout yet. Mr Dunlop will be meeting with guard staff on Friday to work out details. The plan is to have JV and Varsity teams. The new guard staff are excited and ready to go. We need to work on recruiting more students to the guard team. They currently have 9 seniors out of about 20 members.

Winter percussion

Auditions are Tuesday and Friday this week. Staff are currently working on writing the show and getting ready. There will also be a cadet team. Mr Dunlop is working on dates at Brown when the gym is open for them to use.

Skyview Jazz Festival

We are waiting for the schedule to come out for the festival. The SATs are scheduled for that day and the Rainy Day Games fundraiser. Mr Dunlop has asked if the silver and 1:00 jazz bands can perform after 2:00 so that kids in those bands can take SAT and come perform after they are finished. If jazz students have to miss the Rainy Day games fundraiser, they should work on earning points from other fundraisers. There are lots of opportunities.
